S1 - Uniform – reminder that no leggings or joggers **Staffing Updates**

Uniform

This is being adhered to by a large majority of pupils. Discussion about second hand uniform swap/sale and donation of school ties from past pupils.

Holocaust Event - S3 History pupils had an online interactive session with a survivor of the Holocaust and appeared on the STV News and may feature in the Aberdeenshire Holocaust Memorial Day in January 2023.

Physical Health Week - healthy breakfast was a success and all S1s had an experience from our Health and Food Tech pupils about a Healthy Breakfast. House Events are going well.

Speakers4Schools – Mishal Hussain the BBC Newsreader and journalist visited the school and hosted a Q+A session with some Senior Pupils.

Forthcoming **school trips** include a trip to Manchester and a court trip have taken place.

Parents' Evening/GIRFEC Evening/S1 Open Day – our biggest highlight has been in having parents/carers back into the building again, with great feedback from these events and a lot more to come.

Pupil Action Group / National Discussions

The Pupil Action Group (formally the Pupil Council) have reformed and are helping shape school improvements. They are participating in the National Discussion

Focus Groups and the Future of Scottish Education, along with a discussion around bringing back Merits in school to recognise all of the positives of our young people. **Action –Parent Council** to input into the National Discussion Focus Groups and the Future of Scottish Education (discharged)

Review of Expectations for All and school values is being undertaken by the Leadership Team and input from Parent Council welcome! Invite to come!

Exams - Prelims – a timetable will be issued and pupils are being prepared for what is required **Additional Assessments arrangements are** being verified by SQA and their initial visit was positive

Curriculum map –unfortunately the school website is still glitching and a new website is required, the Curriculum Map will follow in due course, along with our 3-Year Vision / SQUIP – Parent/Carer Friendly Version.

Attainment - SQA results (Euan Lawson)

Key measures are against Nat 5, Higher and Advanced Higher results. When other qualifications are taken into account, such as Foundation Apprenticeships, Portlethen Academy is doing well, with good correlation between estimated grades and those achieved. Results are good for maths and english.

Euan noted that for S6 pupils the COVID pandemic has meant that for some pupils S5 and S6 are about consolidation after some difficult years, rather than further progression. In the future there will be more challenge around the reasons for staying on at school, as aware that if there is no progression this could adversely affect work and other studies at college/university. The focus is getting it right for every pupil.

Portlethen Academy is one of the highest attainment schools in Aberdeenshire with a wide breadth of subjects on offer. Need to advertise this better.

Success stories: 5 pupils with 5As at Higher level and 2 pupils with 3 As at Advanced Higher level, as well as pupil success at levels 3 and 4.

Future focus is raising attainment levels including through stretching pupils aims and promoting
