Benefits of Higher Education

Remember! You can go back to Higher Education after college (articulation) or while working (GA)

Further your knowledge and learn subjects not available at school

Higher earnings potential

Overall experience and personal development

Wider career options – some jobs need certain qualifications

Study abroad

Better job prospects



What kind of courses can I study?

Vocational subjects that train you for a job e.g. nursing, engineering or Forensic & Analytical Science.

Subjects that you studied at school e.g.
Mathematics, English, Physics.

Things you may never have heard of- e.g. Construction Management, or Occupational Therapy.



How do you get there?

- Try to take **relevant subjects** if they are on offer.
- Most Universities require a **written subject** even if you are applying for a technical course.
- Try taking a **balance** of subjects so you don't limit yourself.
- Try to get some relevant work experience.
- Take part in wider achievement and volunteering.
- Look out for on-campus events at local universities and colleges – open days.

Application Process

All university applications in the UK are done through UCAS in S6

Applications to college and apprenticeships (including GA) are done out with UCAS. You can apply to college and uniat the same time

There are back up options, e.g. UCAS Plus and 'clearing' if you don't meet your conditional offers
